Operation Basket Drop Support our troops

For those of you that attended the recent GBA convention you may have heard a presentation by GBA and Gwinnett Basket Weaver's Guild member Tracey Reidy whose brother Lt. Col. Lane Turner is currently deployed to Baghdad, Iraq, with the 1st Armored Battalion, Special Troops Division. For a guild project Tracey

proposed to her Guild that they make basket totes filled with goodies for some of her brother's female soldiers whom he has described as mostly 18 to 20 years old and away from home for the first time in their lives. The idea was enthusiastically received by the Gwinnett Guild so the challenge was issued at the convention to other individuals and Guilds willing to participate in this worthwhile project. Pattie Bagley even wove a prototype tote basket (pattern attached) to use as a guide but you may weave whatever you would like (keeping in mind mailing costs and limited personal space for the soldiers).

While initially it was believed that individual soldier's names would be provided to the volunteers, due to privacy issues, this will not be possible. Mail completed totes/goodies to:

Materials

Christmas Tree Bead Wire Handle

11/64" FO - lashing

1/4" FF - weavers & holding row

1/4" FF - dyed red & green

3/8" FO - rims

1/2" FF - spokes & weavers

3/4" FF - 1 spoke

Seagrass

Cut 1 spoke from 3/4" FF 20" long, and 2 spokes from 1/2" FF each 20" long. Then cut 9 spokes from 1/2" FF each 14" long. Soak briefly and mark the center of a few spokes. Lay the 3 long spokes (20" long ones) **horizontal** with the 3/4" FF spoke in the middle. Weave in **vertically** 9 spokes starting with the center spoke and weaver **over** the first spoke (you will be **under** the wide spoke.) Base measures 8 1/4" X 2 1/4". Weave a "holding row" of 1/4" FF, mitering the corners.

Upset the spokes and weave the following rows of start & stop:

1 row 1/2" FF

1 row 1/4" FF green

1 row 1/4" FF red

6 rows 1/4" FF natural

1 row 1/4" FF red

1 row 1/4" FF green

2 rows 1/4" FF natural

Pack well. Cut and tuck spokes - don't forget to put the eyelets on the center spoke. Rim with 3/8" FO, seagrass between rims, and lash with 11/64" FO. Attach the wire handle and stain if you choose. I hot glued on some greenery and red berries for a more "festive look".

Easy recipes to try.

Mango, Black Bean and Wild Rice salad

2 ripe mangoes, chopped and peeled
1 cup thinly sliced green onions
1 cup cooked wild rice
3 Tbsp. finely chopped fresh cilantro
½ cup salsa (fresh or jar)
3 Tbsp. lime juice (fresh or bottle)
3 Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil
¾ tsp. salt
¼ tsp. black pepper
1 (15 oz.) no salt black beans, rinsed and drained

Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Toss gently to mix. Serve chilled

Sugared/Candied Pecans

Mix together: ¾ cup brown sugar
 1 tsp. cinnamon
 ½ tsp. ground nutmeg
 ¼ tsp. ground cloves

2 Tbsp. orange juice
Microwave mixture for 1 minute

Put 3 cups pecans into microwave safe bowl or pan – sprayed with PAM
Pour mixture over the pecans; mix well.

Microwave for 2 minutes; stir; Repeat this process for 6 minutes total.

Turn out onto sprayed aluminum foil; spread apart with 2 spoons. Let cool, may need to break apart.

Peanut Butter Cake

Cake layers

½ lb. of butter
½ cup Crisco
2 ¾ cup sugar
3 cup flour
5 eggs
1 cup milk
1 tsp vanilla

Cream butter, Crisco and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add flour and milk alternately. Add 1 teaspoon flavoring. Mix well. Bake in 9 inch pans at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes.

Frosting

2 cups sugar
½ cup Karo syrup
½ cup light brown sugar
1 stick butter
1 cup evaporated milk
2 tablespoon flour
½ crunchy peanut butter

Mix ingredients together and bring mixture to a boil. Cook 2 ½ minutes after it starts to boil. Cool and add ½ cup crunchy peanut butter. Spread frosting on cake.

News from a new Member:

Right now, I am trying to do as many festivals, crafts show etc. as I can that will let me demonstrate at no charge. I'm trying to get the word out that I am available for classes as well as chair caning. This Saturday I will be at Landmark Park in Dothan, Al demonstrating basket weaving. I have been to Fort Rucker's Arts and Craft center doing classes, but the down side of that is I don't get paid.

I am starting to offer classes and/or open weave sessions on the 1st and 3rd Thursday night as well as the 2nd and 4th Monday nights from 6:30-8:30. I hope that this will help those who work as well as those who are unable to come on Saturdays.

I do have some supplies, mainly reed right now and a few handles. My husband is working on making some wood bases so hopefully we can reduce the cost. There are so many neat baskets made on bases. I also have some shaker tape or webbing. Think I may have found a good supplier that has many more colors than the companies we usually deal with. They also seem to have a better price if you need a large amount.

I am located about 7-10 miles outside the circle just off of Hwy 52 West, in Malvern. If you are coming from Dothan, take Hwy 52 West off the Ross Clark Circle, at Lowe's. Continue on 52 till you get to Malvern, at second caution light; turn right on Co. Rd 49 (Johnston's Meats is on the corner). Take your next right, J.
