

Entrelac is a technique used to create a textured diamond pattern. The resulting fabric looks like woven knitted strips but is actually knitted in one piece. The technique looks more difficult than it is! This scarf is the perfect introduction to entrelac and is great for beginners. WARNING: People will "ooh!" and "aah!" over this scarf when you wear it. They will also think you are a knitting genius when you tell them you made it yourself. The actual simplicity of the pattern will be our little secret. ;-) New to Entrelac? Or just need some extra help? Staci Perry of verypink.com created a wonderful video tutorial based on this pattern. Make your own shape and size, square or round, with or without handle. Include other natural vines for rim/trim or not. 4hrs

Coiled kudzu!

Take short split kudzu vines you "didn't do right" and sew them together in wonderfully fibrous shapes of your choice. 3 hrs

Introduction to Kudzu paper making

Learn all about recycling kudzu leaves into paper. Make several sheets! Learn to embed, flink, pulp paint, more. 1 hrs

Greater Atlanta Basket Guild










Basket Weaver's Guild of GA, Roswell

We take the month of July off but only in order to build excitement for our annual retreat in Helen, GA from Aug. 10-13. It is a time that we look forward to all year.

River Country Basket Guild

The last few months have been busy for our guild. The projects we have completed include



painting, cutting, and weaving watercolor paper baskets. Each person selected the colors and style of paper basket to weave. The next project was Suzanne Moore's "Mallard in the Marsh". This summer we will make pine needle pendants and round reed woven earrings.

Laura Lee Zanger continues to have a busy teaching and vending schedule. She taught at the NCBA convention in Raleigh, NC in March. In April she taught at Stateline Friends in Richmond, Indiana. In June she taught at the Bluegrass Basketmakers gathering in Jabez, Kentucky.

Shooting Creek Basket Guild

Our May 10th meeting included the election of new officers.

The May project was a three stick basket. It includes unusual sticks and small to medium weaving materials. This project is free form and shaping is decided by your sticks that are used as part of the basket and legs to support the basket.

Round reed(#5, 6, or 7) are used for the spokes and #2, 3, or 4 round for weavers. Yarns, seagrass, narrow flat and flat oval reed add variety as weavers.

100% Paper from inner bark of Kudzu and Wisteria Sat July 29, 1am-4pm Tour and talk, process vines, pound, make sheets, include retted vines \$65

Kudzu Weaving Fri. August 25, 9am-4pm Tour and talk, make your own 11x14 loom, split kudzu vines for warp and weft \$65

Kudzu Cloth Sat. August 26, 9am-4pm Tour and talk, process threads from retted green kudzu, tie, make small loom, weave \$65
